Start an Acting on AIDS chapter. The Acting on AIDS structure exists on two levels—as individual chapters on college campuses and as the collective national network of student leaders involved in the program. In order for the national network to be united, it is important for individual chapters to agree upon some basic principles that define the Acting on AIDS identity. This is what we call our covenant. We ask that all aspiring chapters agree to the basic principles of this covenant and complete a simple application to become a chapter.

- We seek to spread awareness of the global AIDS pandemic to our peers, communities, and churches.
- We commit to respond creatively and effectively to the AIDS crisis.
- We commit to encourage our peers to make a commitment to fight the global AIDS pandemic through academic, social, and spiritual endeavors.
