These videos are available on this DVD for your chapter to use at various student functions to promote your upcoming events, or to educate others about HIV and AIDS. Videos such as the ones contained on this toolkit can be the key ingredient to generating momentum for involvement with Acting on AIDS.

“One Heart, One Life” :: 3:27 minutes

This is a moving video that examines the developing world’s lack of access to basic resources such as clean water and education while illustrating the struggle for daily survival that many have to face in these nations. Filled with important images and information, this video challenges viewers to do something with the one life they’ve been given.

“Hidden Faces of AIDS” (intro) :: 60 seconds

Powerful and poignant, this brief video captures not just the statistics of those impacted by HIV and AIDS, but also the real face of those affected.

“Hidden Faces of AIDS” (full length) :: 8:23 minutes

Including the above intro, this video highlights World Vision’s holistic approach to humanitarian relief and caring for those impacted by the HIV/AIDS pandemic.

“Acting on AIDS” :: 3:00 minutes

This video is the visual representation of the Acting on AIDS movement of college students who are responding to the global AIDS pandemic. The video includes student sound bites along with an interview of Steve Haas, Vice President of World Vision.

“World AIDS Day: Lives are at Stake” (intro) :: 1:53 minutes

Highlighting one of Acting on AIDS’ most popular events, Lives are at Stake, this video summarizes the campus-wide awareness and prayer event that occurs on World AIDS Day, December 1.

“World AIDS Day: Lives Are At Stake” (full length) :: 5:01 minutes

The full-length version of this video not only describes the purpose of Lives are at Stake, but shows the impact that the Acting on AIDS student movement has on the entire campus community. The video contains testimonies from students, faculty, and Steve Haas, Vice President of World Vision.

AIDS Photo Compilation :: 2 minutes

Set to background music, this photo series displays simple yet powerful black-and-white images coupled with brief stories of people impacted by HIV and AIDS.
