Michele's heart for youth began at the age of twelve when she was leading a Bible study at her public middle school. In an effort to help her peers understand the world around them, she began leading them in World Vision's 30 Hour Famine.

Seeing the way her group was impacted by helping children around the world, Michele's heart for youth expanded to the poor around the world. At age fourteen, Michele began rallying local youth leaders together for the Famine, drawing in groups from 200-1100 students. For nearly a decade, Michele continued to lead bible studies at her school and lead them in the Famine.

When she was 16, Michele was asked to travel with World Vision to Cuzco, Peru to see the transformative work the Famine funds were doing in South America's rural communities. It was here in Peru that Michele met a little girl named Maria. Upon leaving, Maria asked Michele to remember her and tell about her. Arriving back in the states, Michele had a renewed passion for seeing youth think beyond themselves and tell the stories of those like Maria who couldn't speak for themselves.

At seventeen, Michele was hired by World Vision to assist youth leaders with fundraising, speaking, and coordinating events for the 30 Hour Famine. Since then she has also served on the World Vision Experiential Engagement Team reaching out to 45,000 volunteers. In her spare time, Michele worked as a youth director in Tacoma and earned a B.A. in Political Economy from the University of Washington with a focus in Non-profit Management and Human Rights. In 2009, Michele once again joined the 30 Hour Famine team. She is now working on upcoming Famine initiatives and organizing a team of representatives to increase the Famine's impact.

Michele also joined the World Vision Speaker's Bureau in 2009. Combining her gift of communication with personal, professional, and spiritual experiences, Michele is able to connect with audiences of all sizes and issues.
