Corryne Deliberto is the Domestic Policy Advisor for World Vision-US. She oversees the organization's public policy portfolio related to domestic poverty and social issues that affect the well-being of vulnerable children and youth in the United States. Currently, she manages World Vision's advocacy and policy strategy on the issues of youth violence prevention, improvements to public education, and U.S. disaster response. She also serves as a technical advisor to World Vision's Youth Empowerment Project, a youth leadership and civic engagement program that seeks to strengthen the voice of young people in public policy reform.

Corryne has worked for World Vision since 2001. Before returning to Washington DC to assume her current role, Corryne served as the Executive Director of New York Programs. She oversaw World Vision's outreach to New York City's at-risk youth and their families through three programs: Vision Youth, The Storehouse, and Tools for Transformation. She also served as a member of the Advocacy Council of the Citizens' Committee for Children of New York and a member of the Junior Board of the Enterprise Foundation in New York.

Prior to her New York post, Corryne served as the Public Sector Grants Manager for World Vision U.S. Programs based in Washington DC where she worked to secure over \$5 million in federal and state government funding for World Vision's projects in eight metropolitan areas throughout the United States.

Before joining World Vision, Corryne served as a political appointee of the Clinton Administration at the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development under Secretary Andrew Cuomo and worked in the Office of Faith-based and Community Initiatives. Prior to her term at HUD, Corryne worked for Catholic Relief Services (CRS). During her eight years there, she served as the Deputy Director of CRS's Latin America/Caribbean Regional Office and the Director of Operation Rice Bowl, CRS's national Lenten education and fundraising campaign taking place in over 15,000 Catholic parishes nationwide.

Corryne holds a Bachelor's Degree in Sociology from Fordham University and a Master's Degree in Social Policy from American University.
